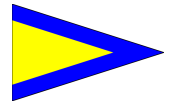


Round 3 – Part 1 Flag Signals

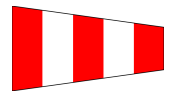
1. This flag is displayed shortly after the start. How many boats must return to the start?

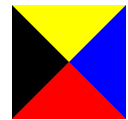
2. In a different race, this flag is displayed. How many boats should return to the start? _____ (1)

- b. What must you do next? _____ (1)



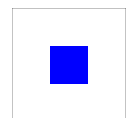
6. This flag is displayed from the race-hut mast. Many sound signals are made.

Round 3 - Part 2 Definitions

Where you see blank, or blankety-blank, these words replace the definition words that are within the definition.

1. A course a boat would sail to *finish* as soon as possible in the absence of the other boats referred to in the rule using the term. A boat has no *blankety blank* before her starting signal.

2. The space a boat needs in the existing conditions while maneuvering promptly in a seamanlike way.

A boat *blanks* when any part of her hull, or crew or equipment in normal position, crosses the finishing line in the direction of the course from the last *mark*, either for the first time or after taking a penalty under rule 44.2 or, after correcting an error made at the finishing line, under rule 28.1.

4. A boat is *blank a mark* when she is in a position to pass to windward of it and leave it on the required side without changing *tack*.
